## The Background – 5 Kings Versus 4 (14:1-12)

In this chapter we read about five kings in Canaan who were vassal states of a king named Chedorlaomer, living near what would later be Babylon. After making tribute payments for twelve years, these kings decided to rebel against Chedorlaomer, and in response he gathered his allies and came down to teach these rebels a lesson.
