COMMITMENT #10 - COMMITTED TO FAMILIES

When Colonial's first members signed the church's charter, they made a covenantal commitment. Every subsequent member has been added to a community committed to a covenant. While Colonial's Covenant is subordinate to Scripture, nevertheless, it remains an important document for those who would walk together in harmony (Amos 3:3). The third paragraph of Colonial's Covenant says:

We engage to maintain family and private devotions; to train our children in the fear and the admonition of the Lord; (and) to seek the salvation of our kindred.

This paragraph calls for every member to make a commitment to our families. The foundations of the family have been under attack for decades in America (Ps. 11:3). With the destruction of America's family values there has been a growing ______ anarchy.
