COMMITMENT #7 SUSTAINING!

How important is the church to you? I Tim. 3:14 tells us that the church is the pillar and the ground of the _______. In 1909, Newport White wrote the following: "The church is the divinely constituted human society by which the support and maintenance in the world of revealed truth is conditioned. Truth revealed to isolated individuals, no matter how numerous, would be dissipated in the world. But the Divine Society, in which it is given an objective existence, at once compels the world to take knowledge of it, and assures those who receive the revelations that it is independent of and external to, themselves and not a mere fancy of their own!" (The Expositors Greek Testament) It is in the local church that the saints gather to be sustained by and to sustain truth!

As Colonial Hills Baptist Church celebrates nearly 60 years of God's faithfulness, it is well for us to consider carefully the covenant entered into by all those that are members of this assembly. The second paragraph of our Covenant focuses on the and reads as follows:

We engage, therefore, by the aid of the Holy Spirit, to walk together in Christian love; to strive for the advancement of this church in knowledge, holiness, and comfort; to promote its prosperity and spirituality; to sustain its worship, ordinance, discipline, and doctrines; to contribute cheerfully and regularly to the support of the ministry, the expenses of the church, the relief of the poor, and the spread of the gospel through all nations.

Having previously considered our commitment to sustain the worship of our church, let's consider 3 more sustaining responsibilities. Every member of the church is a sustainer of the church!

SUSTAIN THE DUTIES OF THE CHURCH

Unlike many denominations that speak of sacraments (church rites through which grace is said to be administered), our Covenant teaches that those who know the blessings of grace are to be committed to the sustaining of church "ordinances." An ordinance is a symbolic act commanded by Jesus to commemorate what He did to purchase our ________. Keeping the ordinances is a matter of duty!

"Church Discipline" is to many churches a relic of a by-gone era. Sadly, there is little purity in the church of the 21st century because there is little discipline applied. The leaven of sin has come to permeate and pollute the purity of the church (I Cor. 5:1-7).
