



## Lesson 10 – “Born This Way?”

### Homosexuality

How should believers live in a world where saying “I won’t bake a cake for a gay wedding” may result in a massive court case or where saying something as benign as “Homosexuality is a sin before God” might cost someone their job?

#### The Biblical Case against Homosexuality

##### The Bible’s View of \_\_\_\_\_

Some argue, “Jesus never condemned homosexuality.” While this is technically true, Jesus make clear that Genesis 1-2 was the pattern for marriage. He was careful to include that this means God made them male and female, and that was part of God’s plan for marriage.

##### The Bible’s Prohibitions of \_\_\_\_\_

1. \_\_\_\_\_ and Gomorrah (Genesis 19 and Jude 7)

Some argue the real problem with Sodom was attempted rape and inhospitality, not homosexuality. But Jews frequently read condemned homosexuality based on Sodom, Ezekiel 16:50 describes the “abomination” of Sodom (the same word used to describe homosexuality in Leviticus), and in Jude 7 the men in Sodom were pursuing what they believed were men.

2. \_\_\_\_\_ (Leviticus 18:22; 20:13)

Twice Leviticus forbids homosexuality (18:22; 20:13). Again, some argue this is the Old Testament law, so it isn’t binding today, and it is targeting cultural practices that no longer apply. But this passage is in a context of general sexual laws, and the verses themselves are very broad, not limited in any way.



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3. Paul's \_\_\_\_\_ of homosexuality (Romans 1:24-27)

Romans 1 clearly condemns homosexuality, as both male and female homosexuality is described as a perversion against nature. Those who try to continue to hold to homosexuality must end up arguing that Paul got it wrong, and that we know better now.

4. \_\_\_\_\_ (1 Corinthians 6:9; 1 Timothy 1:10)

Twice the New Testament uses a Greek word (*arsenokoites*) which, although debated, should be translated "homosexual."

### Helping Believers Think Rightly about Homosexuality

Thinking Rightly about \_\_\_\_\_

The Bible defines us, not by our broken desires, but by our position in Christ. And those who are in Christ have been cleansed from their past sins and have been made new (2 Cor 5:17, 1 Cor 6:9-11).

Thinking Rightly about \_\_\_\_\_

Once we stop seeing homosexuality as an ironclad identity or as an unpardonable sin, we can begin to see it as another area in which we must die to self and walk by the Spirit (Matt 16:24-25; Gal 5:16-17).

### Sharing the Gospel with Homosexuals

Homosexuals are not beyond the reach of the gospel (1 Cor 6:9-11).

No sin is so bad that someone cannot be saved. Those who have thrown themselves into the LGBTQ movement can still be saved.

Homosexuals' greatest problem is their \_\_\_\_\_ against God (Romans 3:23; 6:23).

Homosexuality is one sin among many, and a person's greatest need is not to stop being gay, but to turn from their sin to the Savior.

Homosexuals are saved like \_\_\_\_\_ else (Romans 10:13)

Sharing the gospel with someone who claims to be gay is at its core not different from sharing the gospel with someone who is engaged in a different sin. All sinners need to recognize their sin and turn in faith to Christ for forgiveness of sin.

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
