Paul warns that we not be conformed to the world, but instead should be transformed in the way we think. Worldly thinking will lead to worldly living, and consecrated thinking will lead to holy living.

Christians must beware the danger of thinking too highly of themselves, but also the danger of thinking they are worthless. God has given every believer spiritual gifts, and Christians should think humbly but seriously about what their gift is and seek to use it for God's glory and others' good.
