The Old Testament predicted that when the Messiah came, He would be empowered by the Spirit of God. When Jesus comes, we find by reading the gospels carefully that His life and ministry were indeed filled with the power of the Spirit.

The Spirit and the Old Testament ___

In Jesus's first sermon in Luke, He reads a portion of Scripture from Isaiah 61:1-3. In this passage, the anointed one (i.e., the Messiah) has a mission to accomplish God's purposes in the earth, and the Spirit comes upon the servant of God to empower him for this ministry. This lines up with other passages such as Isaiah 11:1 and 42:1, which describe the coming ruler as someone who has the Spirit of God rest upon him. This shows us that the Jews would have been expecting a coming Messiah who was Spirit-empowered.
